Question 1: What is your definition of Virtual Leasing for Non-Profits?

Answer 1: The non-profit virtual leasing should include the ability for a user to customize their search through options like number of bedrooms, bathrooms, etc., view virtual tours of the property; arrange furniture utilizing floor plans; interactive e-maps; ability to submit applications, payments, lease renewals and work orders on-line, etc. and other user-friendly functions

Question 2: How many non-technical content editors will be updating the website?

Answer 2: No more than six SAHA employees will be updating the website.

Question 3: Would SAHA prefer to own the CMS software or a CMS software subscription where you lease the use of the CMS software on an annual basis?

Answer 3: At this time, we are open to recommendations for which method for the CMS software is ideal for maintaining the website and is cost effective.

Question 4: Would SAHA want Revize to host the website or will it be running on SAHA servers?

Answer 4: The website will be running on SAHA servers.

Question 5: Is the "landlords only area" expected to be a password protected area of the website? Will it be linked to external databases or simply contain documents and pages?

Answer 5: The page that landlords can visit on saha.org is not currently password protected. Anyone can look at the general page, but a login (password) is required if the landlord wants to access the information specific to them. That login takes them to internal SAHA databases, which will remain the same after the redesign of saha.org.

Question 6: What is the budget for the project?

Answer 6: There is not a budget for this project.

Question 7: Would SAHA be interested in a multi-year contract that spreads the initial development costs over a period of years to reduce upfront costs?



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Answer 7: At this time, SAHA is interested in the costs being accrued during the initial development.

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
