- 2.0 APPLICABILITY:** By submitting a quote (hereinafter referred to as "bid") to SAHA, the firm or individual doing so (hereinafter, "the bidder") is automatically agreeing to abide by all terms and conditions listed herein, including those terms and conditions within the HUD document, *HUD 5370EZ*, HUD Handbook 7460.8 REV 2, Procurement Handbook for Public Housing Agencies, dated 2/2007, the attached Davis Bacon Wage Decision and SAHA General Terms and Conditions which are incorporated by reference. - 3.0 SAHA's RESERVATION OF RIGHTS:** SAHA reserves the right to:

13.9.5 The existing handicap pole signage (placards) as indicated on the drawings are to remain in place.

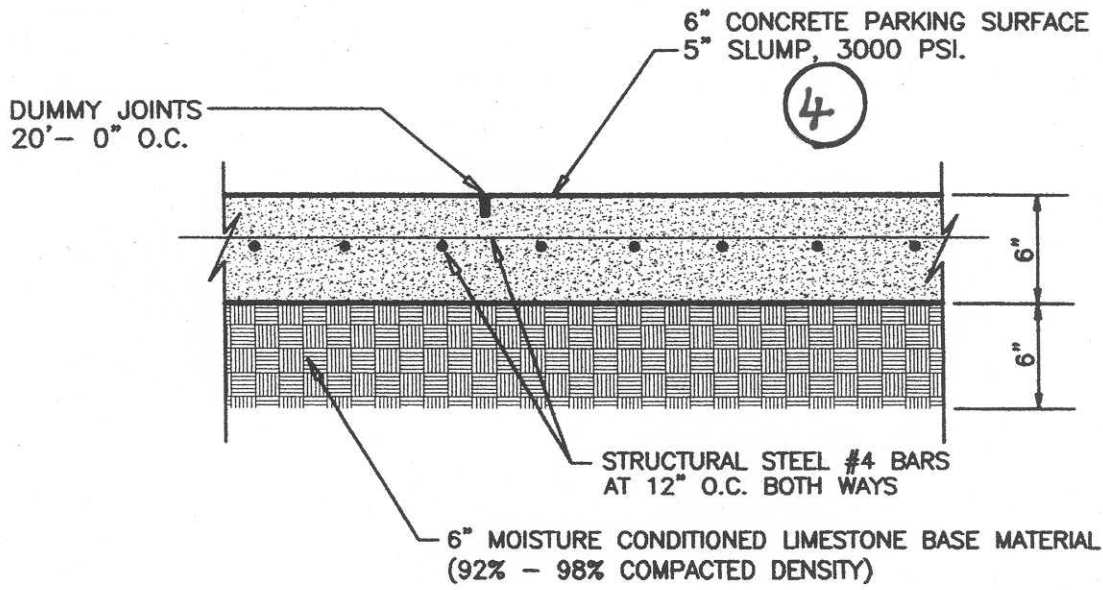

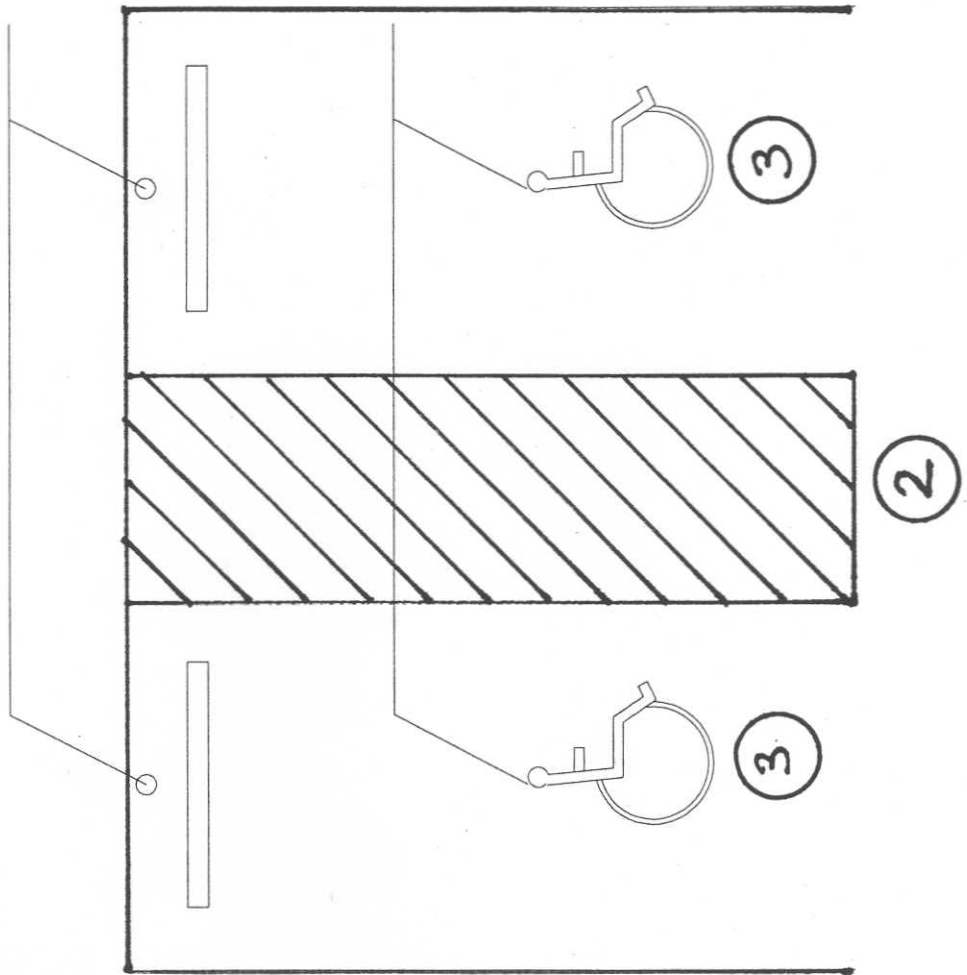

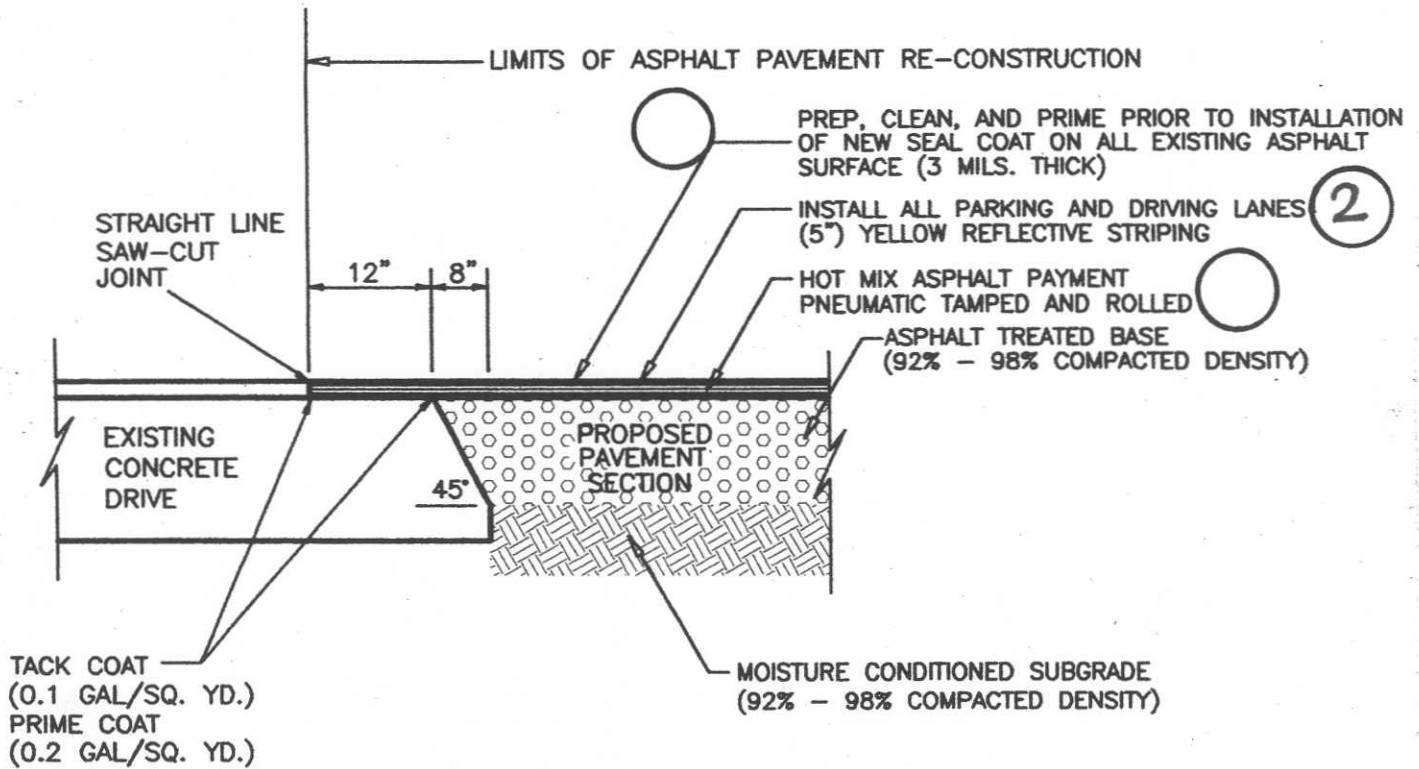

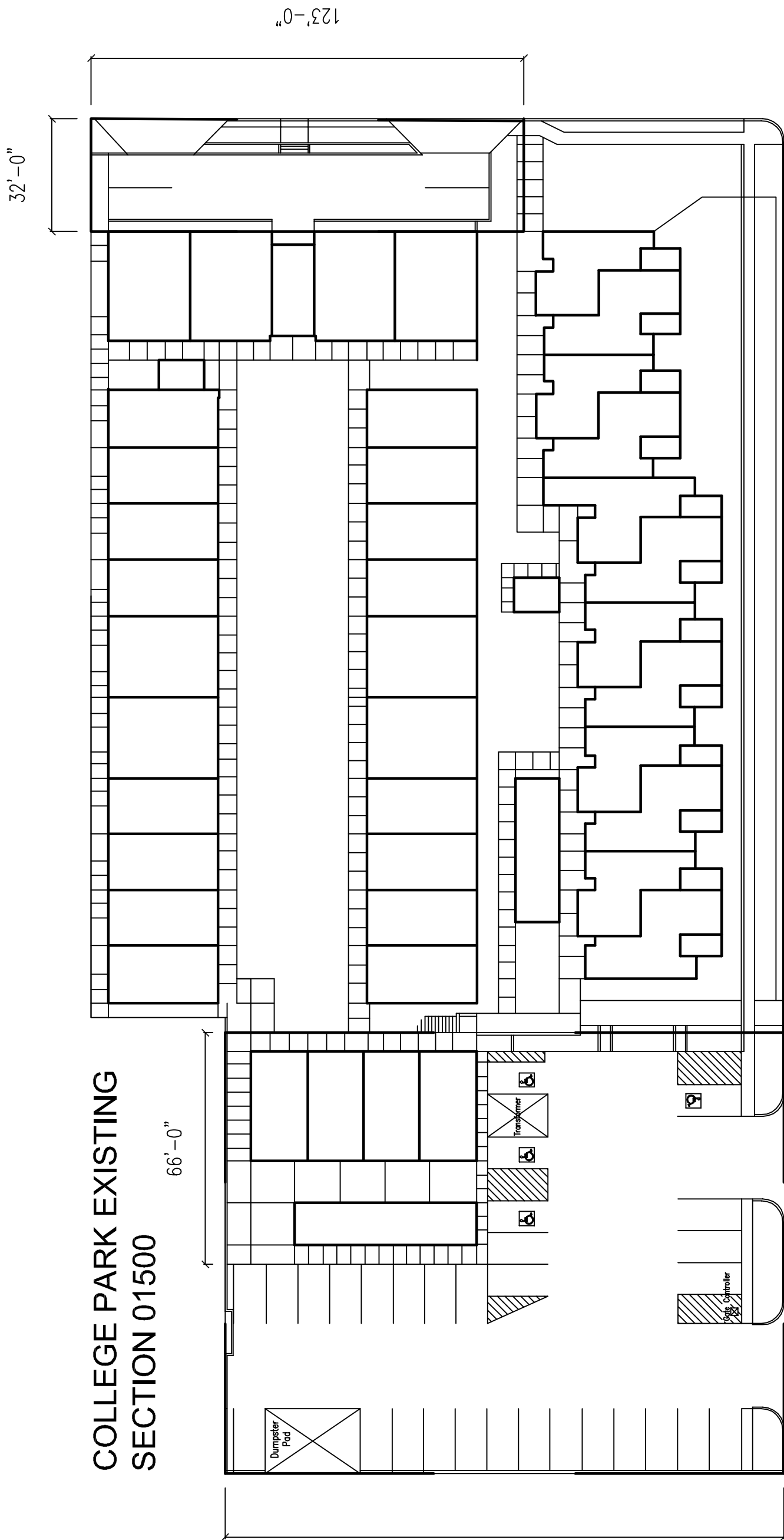

SCOPE OF WORK ITEMS

The Individual work items at this SAHA development are described in the schedule below and the Detailed Drawings. The Scope items on this list shall include all quantities that are explained to the contractor on this Schedule. All Bidders and Sub-bidders are to analyze, and quantify by reviewing all documents, and field-verify all required work items, and their intended application at these sites. All Bidders shall immediately notify the Owner and his representatives of any differing field conditions. All work items shall be installed complete, and shall include Demolition, Disposal, Preparation, Installation, Overhead, Profit, Insurance, Labor Burden, and removal of any encumbrances that obstruct the installation of the turn-keyed items, for example: Existing Utilities, Property Right of Way, City of San Antonio Setbacks, Equipment Pads, Large Trees, Miscellaneous Vegetation, and Adjacent Structures, etc.

No.	Scope of Work
1	Power wash, Degrease, and Apply (18") wide on entire Concrete Curb Fire Lane Markings , to include all prepping, cleaning, priming, and painting of the total specified areas with RED highly reflective pigments. Next apply (6") tall (100%) acrylic enamel paint stencil with "FIRE LANE NO PARKING" wording at every (30') o.c. Contractor must field verify all quantities for (100%) acrylic enamel paint applications (2) coats minimum. See Specifications, Drawing Details, and Development Site Plans.
2	Power wash, Degrease, and Apply (5") wide florescent Concrete Pavement Striping , to include all prepping, cleaning, priming, and striping of the total specified areas with YELLOW highly reflective pigments. SAHA to verify the installation of parking lane markings with the contractor Stripe must be (18'-20') long. At (9') o.c. Contractor must field verify all quantities for (100%) chlorinated rubber base paint applications (2) coats minimum. See Specifications, Drawing Details, and Development Site Plans.
3	Sweep, Power wash, Degrease, Clean, and Install rubberized Concrete ADA Paint Marking for existing asphalt paved and concrete paved areas at the site, to include all prepping, cleaning, priming, and painting of the entire parking lot. The ADA, marking must be (48"x 48") florescent blue background (100%) chlorinated rubber base (2) coats minimum with Handicapped Symbol (36" x 36") fluorescent white insignia (100%) chlorinated rubber base (2) coats minimum. SAHA to verify the installation of handicap parking markings with the contractor. See Specifications, Drawing Details, and Development Site Plans.
4	Demolish damaged ADA. ramps and Install (3000) psi (5") thick Concrete Handicapped Ramps to include all form work, installation of (#3) Re-bar at (12") o.c. over new (6") thick crushed limestone base stabilization materials. Contractor must field verify all quantities for concrete, limestone base material, form work, rebar, and dowels, and all applicable asphalt expansion joints, and removal of any encumbrances. All newly installed concrete surfaces cannot exceed a run slope of (5%) and a cross slope of (2%). See Specifications, Drawing Details, and Development Site Plans.
5	Pressure Solvent Clean any and all greasy or stained surfaces or substrates, to include all concrete parking and drive zones adjacent to all structures at this development scheduled for work to be performed. to include all detergents, degreasers, and solvents. Apply all biodegradable chemicals as directed by manufacturer's recommendations. Contractor must field verify all conditions mentioned above, for complete turnkey installation. See Specifications, Drawing Details, and Development Site Plans.
6	Saw-cut, Chip, Clean, and Motar (7000) psi. polymer reinforced non-sag concrete ADA Durapatch Surface or equivalent material on areas that are broken, cracked, and spalled etc. All quantities must include saw cutting, hammering, and disposal of all existing badly damaged concrete ADA Ramp regions, and provide for positive drainage. Contractor must field verify all quantities for demolition, chipping, cleaning, and sealing of exposed re-bar. All newly installed concrete surfaces cannot exceed a run slope of (5%) and a cross-slope of (2%). See Specifications, Drawing Details, and Development Site Plans.

SECTION 02750 CONCRETE PAVING

PART 1 GENERAL

1.01 SUMMARY

- A. Provide Portland cement concrete paving where shown on the Drawings, as specified herein, and as needed for a complete and proper installation.

1.02 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. Perform work in accordance with ACI 301.

PART 2 PRODUCTS

2.01 FORMS

- A. Provide wood or metal formwork profiled to suit conditions, including adequate bracing to the lines and grades shown on the Drawings.
- B. Earth forms will not be permitted for paving.

2.02 REINFORCEMENT

- A. Comply with the following as minimums:
 - 1. Bars: ASTM A615/A615M, grade 60, unless otherwise shown on the Drawings, using deformed bars for number 3 and larger.
 - 2. Welded wire fabric: ASTM A185, plain type in coiled rolls, unfinished.
 - 3. Bending: ACI 318.

2.03 CONCRETE MIX

- A. Provide concrete with the following characteristics:
 - 1. Compressive strength at 7 days: 2250 psi.
 - 2. Compressive strength at 28 days: 3000 psi.
 - 3. Slump: 5 inches maximum.
 - 4. Water: Clean and potable.
- B. Use only such additives as are recommended in the mix design and approved by the Owner and governmental agencies having jurisdiction.

PART 3 EXECUTION

3.01 SURFACE CONDITIONS

- A. Examine the areas and conditions under which work of this Section will be performed. Correct conditions detrimental to timely and proper completion of the Work. Do not proceed until unsatisfactory conditions are corrected.

3.02 FINAL PREPARATION OF SUBGRADES

- A. Thoroughly scarify and sprinkle the entire area to be paved. Compact to a smooth, hard, even surface of 90 percent compaction to receive the aggregates.

3.03 PLACEMENT OF BASE COURSE

- A. Base (where required):
 1. Spread the specified coarse aggregate to a thickness providing the compacted thickness shown on the Drawings.
 2. Compact to 95 percent.
 3. Moisten substrate to minimize absorption of water from fresh concrete.

3.04 FORMING

- A. Place and secure forms to correct location, dimension and profile.

3.05 INSTALLATION

- A. Upon completion of base course and formwork, install reinforcement as shown on the Drawings.
- B. Transit mix the concrete in accordance with provisions of ASTM C94.
- C. Do not use concrete that has stood over 30 minutes after leaving the mixer, or concrete that is not placed within 60 minutes after water is introduced into the mix.
- D. Placing concrete:
 1. Place concrete on accordance with ACI 301.
 2. Remove rejected concrete from the site.
 3. Do not disturb reinforcement or formwork components during concrete placement.
- E. Deposit and consolidate concrete in a continuous operation within the limits of construction joints until the placing of a panel or section is completed.
 1. Bring surfaces to the correct level with a straightedge, and then strike off.
 2. Smooth the surface leaving it free from bumps and hollows.

3. Do not sprinkle water on the plastic surface. Do not disturb the surfaces prior to start of finishing operations.

F. Expansion joints:

1. Locate expansion joints where indicated, filled to full depth with expansion joint material.
2. In curbs, locate 1/2 inch thick joint at the beginning and end of curves, and at 25 foot centers elsewhere.
3. In curbs and paving, hold down 1/2 inch and seal exposed joints with joint sealer.

G. Finishing:

1. Float to produce a surface level within 1/4 inch in 2 feet.
2. With a bristle broom produce a medium textured finish or as directed by the Owner.

2.01 PRODUCTS

A. Striping Paint

1. Type: Vinyl-latex emulsion, non-bleeding, formulated specifically for painting in vehicular traffic areas, containing the following minimum non-volatiles by weight:

Yellow: 50 percent
Red: 42 percent

B. Colors:

1. Parking stall striping, directional markings and restricted parking zone markings: White

In the listing above, the "SU" designation means that rates listed under the identifier do not reflect collectively bargained wage and fringe benefit rates. Other designations indicate unions whose rates have been determined to be prevailing.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.
