REQUESTED ACTION:

Consideration and appropriate action regarding Resolution 5971, authorizing the President and CEO to approve and proceed with a self-funded, third-party provider of SAHA employee medical and dental plans plus fully insured vision, short-term disability, long-term disability, life insurance benefit plans and an electronic benefits enrollment platform for calendar year 2020, at a total cost not to exceed \$5,215,705.00.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The total proposed cost for the SAHA self-funded (self-insured) medical and dental plans for January 1, 2020, through December 31, 2020, is projected to be \$5,055,476.00. Included in this projected cost is the annual administrative fee for the operation of the self-funded plan of \$101,374.00, projected claims costs of \$4,006,014.00, and an estimated stop loss premium of \$948,088.00.

SAHA will implement programs to control costs in the area of prescriptions. Presently, SAHA participates in the Blue Cross Blue Shield (BCBS) Basic Drug Formulary. A move to a Balanced Formulary and the addition of Step Therapy and Prior Authorization will present a total savings of \$142,216.00. When allowed to do so, staff will grandfather current employees in various programs to minimize impact. However, twenty-five employees, representing approximately 6% of our total population may find themselves requiring additional steps in obtaining their current prescriptions. SAHA will also implement Livongo, a program of enhanced care for those individuals with diabetes. The projected cost of \$41,950.00 covers approximately fifty employees. Similarly, an incremental fee of \$650.00 for the year will further support cessation efforts for employees that wish to stop using nicotine products. The net effect of these programs is a savings of \$99,616.00.

The total proposed cost for SAHA's fully insured programs of vision, employer paid life/accidental death and dismemberment (ad&d), short-term and long-term disability and the Employee Assistance Plan is \$260,804.00. The agency will maintain Avesis as the carrier for vision coverage. However, for Employer Paid Life and Accidental Death & Dismemberment (1X Base Salary), plus Short Term Disability and Long Term Disability, the agency proposes to move forward with a new provider. Dearborn National Life Insurance Company, which is affiliated with

Blue Cross Blue Shield. A transfer from Prudential to Dearborn National Life Insurance Company will afford SAHA the following:

- A first year discount of \$45,000.00 for the bundling of our medical/dental products with our disability and employer paid life and ad&d products.
- The ability to match current voluntary products for Supplemental Life and Accidental Death and Dismemberment for Employee, Spouse and Child coverage.
- The ability to offer extended Voluntary products for Critical Illness and Accident Coverage.
- The ability to provide 3rd party services for the management of FMLA and ADA claims. This partnership is to minimize compliance and risk issues that can arise if claims are mismanaged. The costs for the services is projected to be \$11,967.00.

In addition to the Voluntary products, the Agency requests the opportunity to offer MetLife at no cost to the organization. MetLife benefits include access to a network of attorneys to assist with:

- Identity Theft
- Estate Planning
- Elder Care Issues

Over the past two years, SAHA has utilized an electronic benefits enrollment system (SmartBen) and an electronic system (Accord), for issuing required forms under the Affordable Care Act. The two programs have a combined cost of \$32,074.00.

These costs are reflected in the approved 2019 - 2020 budget and represent a total decrease of 11.18% from the 2019 budget projections.

SUMMARY:

In 2008, SAHA moved to a self-funded (self-insured) plan to help control the rising costs of health care. Two PPO plans are offered to employees: a standard (lower cost) PPO plan and a richer (higher cost) PPO plan for which the employee bears a larger share of the cost. There are currently 405 employees in the plans; 302 are enrolled in the low PPO plan and 103 are enrolled in the high PPO plan.

McGriff, Seibels & Williams of Texas, Inc. (MSW) is the current Benefits Consultant. MSW issued a Request for Proposals on SAHA's behalf for 2020 for a carrier for Life (Basic, Voluntary and Accidental Death and Dismemberment, Short Term Disability, Long Term Disability and other Voluntary Products.

The BCBS medical and dental plans are under a rate guarantee for 2020. SAHA reviews benefits and funding of the plan annually. There will be no increase to employee contributions or SAHA's funding level. There will also be no increase to deductibles nor co-pays.

A stop-loss premium increase of 15% is included in the 2020 projections. Stop-loss proposals require additional claims experience before costs can be finalized. Final Stop Loss costs are expected to be available by December 1, 2019.

SAHA remains highly competitive and favorable in comparison to other employers with an average employer contribution of 85% compared to the 15% employee contribution. The same holds true for deductible amounts, out of pocket maximums, and copayments, as compared to other similar employer packages.

Ongoing Health and Wellness Initiatives:

- Reimbursements for certified weight loss programs and gym memberships
- Reimbursements for participation in health and wellness events
- Annual health and safety fairs
- Monthly vitamin shot clinics
- Spring event with exercise demonstrations and various fitness activities

The proposed benefits program for SAHA employees in 2020 will include the most competitive:

- Health care carrier as the third-party provider of employee medical and dental plans
- Provider for the employee vision plan
- Third-party provider of employee long-term and short-term disability plans
- Provider for employee life insurance and accidental death and dismemberment
- Provider for enhanced voluntary products
- Provider for employee Section 125 Flexible Spending Plan
- Provider for 3rd party FMLA and ADA administration

RESOLUTION 5971, AUTHORIZING THE PRESIDENT AND CEO TO APPROVE AND PROCEED WITH A SELF-FUNDED, THIRD-PARTY PROVIDER OF SAHA EMPLOYEE MEDICAL AND DENTAL PLANS PLUS FULLY INSURED VISION, SHORT-TERM DISABILITY, LONG-TERM DISABILITY, LIFE INSURANCE BENEFIT PLANS AND AN ELECTRONIC BENEFITS ENROLLMENT PLATFORM FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2020, AT A TOTAL COST NOT TO EXCEED \$5,215,705.00

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Housing Authority (SAHA) desires to provide a wide range of insurance benefits for its employees; and

WHEREAS, the current employee self-insured administration contracts will terminate on December 31, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the total cost for the SAHA self-funded (self-insured) medical and dental plans for January 1, 2020, through December 31, 2020, is projected to be \$5,055,476.00; and

WHEREAS, included in this projected cost is the total annual administrative fee paid to Blue Cross Blue Shield for the operation of the self-funded plan of \$101,374.00, the stop loss fee of \$948,088.00, and a projected claims amount of \$4,006,014.00; and

WHEREAS, SAHA will implement programs to control costs in the area of prescriptions with projected savings of \$142,216.00. SAHA will fund a program to support extended diabetes care at a cost of \$41,950.00 and nicotine cessation at \$650.00 per year. These combined programs are projected to produce a net savings of \$99,616.00; and

WHEREAS, the total proposed cost for SAHA's fully insured programs of vision, life, short term, and long term disability is \$260,804.00, and SAHA proposes to move forward with Dearborn National Life Insurance Company as a new carrier for Basic Life and Accidental Death and Dismemberment, Short Term Disability and Long Term Disability. Dearborn will offer other Voluntary products to include Critical Illness and Accident Coverage; and

WHEREAS, the addition of Dearborn National Life Insurance Company will result in first year savings of \$45,000.00 and the ability to utilize third party services in the administration of Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) and Americans with Disability Act (ADA) claims. These services are projected to cost \$11,967.00; and

WHEREAS, the proposed approximate annual cost for an electronic benefits enrollment platform, and a third party provider of tax forms required per the Affordable Care Act is \$32,074.00; and

WHEREAS, the costs are within the Board approved FY 2019-2020 operating budget; and

WHEREAS, staff requests the Board of Commissioners authorize the President and CEO, or designee, to execute all documents necessary to carry out the various transactions described above.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of SAHA hereby:

- 1) Approves Resolution 5971, authorizing the President and CEO to approve and proceed with a self-funded, third-party provider of SAHA employee medical and dental plans plus fully insured vision, short term disability, long term disability, and life insurance benefit plans, an electronic benefits enrollment platform for calendar year 2020, and third party providers for administrative services at a total cost not to exceed \$5,215,705.00.
- 2) Authorizes the President and CEO, or designee, to execute all documents necessary to carry out the various transactions authorized above.

REQUESTED ACTION:

Consideration and appropriate action regarding Resolution 5967, authorizing the award of a contract for insurance broker of record for commercial property casualty and other SAHA insurance related services to McGriff, Seibels & Williams, Inc. for an annual cumulative amount not to exceed \$24,000.00 for year one, \$25,000.00 for year two, \$26,000.00 for year three, \$27,000.00 for year four, and \$28,000.00 for year five; for a period of one year with the option to renew up to four additional one-year terms.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The current award recommendation for the insurance broker of record for commercial, property, casualty, and other SAHA insurance related services is not expected to exceed an annual cumulative amount of \$24,000.00 for year one, \$25,000.00 for year two, \$26,000.00 for year three, \$27,000.00 for year four, and \$28,000.00 for year five and will be funded through the operating budgets and/or available reserves.

SUMMARY:

SAHA requires a Broker of Record (BOR) to ensure compliance with the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and lender insurance requirements. In addition, the BOR assists SAHA in its annual insurance renewal or placement process to protect its assets – real property, human capital, program participants/visitors and operational processes.

The current BOR is McGriff, Seibels, and Williams (MSW). The local branch of MSW is exclusively a broker for public entities including public housing authorities (PHAs). MSW has proven to be a knowledgeable, hands-on, strategic partner who understands the public housing business well. They bring many tools and relevant experience to the table including, but not limited to, loss prevention, loss control, analysis, trending data and creative solutions to assist on matters of risk. MSW also brings consultation services, training resources and licenses that allow premium

comparisons in the market.

SAHA's primary insurer for property developments is HAI Group. SAHA has an historic and vested interest in HAI Group who is an insurer for PHAs only nationwide. In the mid-1980s, the public housing community faced a crisis as insurance companies refused to insure PHAs. PHAs were labeled as high risk and rising premiums reached unaffordable levels despite being required by HUD. In 1987, a solution emerged -- the Housing Authority Insurance Group (HAI Group) was formed; it is a member owned organization originally funded by the PHAs it insures. Founding PHAs, including SAHA, became member owners in 1987, when they paid into HAI Group to fund insuring fellow member/owner PHAs. The initial investment has paid for itself many times over and SAHA's current equity stands at about \$640,000.00.

HAI Group remains the most competitive insurer for PHAs. Staff conducts market penetration studies every two years to remain current and relevant in premium comparisons. HAI Group has a reciprocal relationship with its members. SAHA receives annual dividend disbursements from HAI Group, averaging \$100,000.00 a year. These dividends are paid to all member owners based on the annual performance of the insurance company, global catastrophic losses, and loss prevention measures executed by staff.

On July 12, 2019, SAHA issued a Request For Proposals #1906-953-52-4937 for Insurance Broker of Record for Commercial, Property, Casualty, and other SAHA insurance Related Services that closed on August 12, 2019. The RFP was published on the SAHA website, Electronic State Business Daily (ESBD), The Hart Beat, posted on NAHRO, Public Purchase and direct solicited to fifty-six firms. A total of four proposals were received in response to this solicitation: Arthur J Gallagher Risk Management Services (Austin), Arthur J Gallagher Risk Management Services (Dallas), McGriff, Seibels & Williams, Inc., and USI Southwest, Inc. All proposals were evaluated on the following criteria: experience and capacity of consultant, quality and methodology, disclosures/financial capability, fees/cost, strength of the consultant's Section 3 Utilization Plan, and Strength of the consultant's SWMBE Plan. Based on the above, we are recommending contract award to McGriff Seibels & Williams, Inc. They are the highest rated responsive and responsible proposer.

McGriff, Seibels & Williams, Inc. was founded in 1886, and is headquartered in Birmingham, Alabama, with field office locations in Denver, Colorado; Atlanta, Georgia; New Orleans, Louisiana; St. Louis, Missouri; Portland, Oregon; Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; Addison, Houston, and San Antonio, Texas; and Seattle, Washington. This firm provides commercial insurance, construction risk, employee benefits, energy and marine, financial services, recreation marine and surety. FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The current award recommendation for technical accounting and GASB consulting services is not expected to exceed an annual cumulative amount of \$100,000.00 for year one and \$50,000.00 each year for year two through year five and will be funded through the operating budget and/or available reserves.

SUMMARY:

SAHA requires the services of a consultant to provide advice and technical assistance on complex accounting and financial reporting matters. Additionally, the consultant will be required to conduct a review of new GASB or other applicable accounting pronouncements to include providing recommendations for implementation, as well as, guidance with Uniform Guidance. SAHA does not possess the in-house resources necessary to keep pace with the plethora of emerging accounting rules and compliance requirements. A consultant which SAHA can utilize on an as-needed basis is a viable option due to limited resources, reduced staffing, and ongoing funding issues. A total of seven proposals were received in response to this solicitation: Aprio, LLP, BDO USA, LLP, BDK, LLP, Citrin Cooperman, LLP, CliftonLarsonAllen, LLP, Deloitte & Touche, LLP, and Innovative Financial Housing Solutions, Inc. (WBE). All proposals were evaluated on the following criteria: experience and capacity of consultant, quality and methodology, disclosures/financial capability, fees/cost, strength of the

REQUESTED ACTION:

Consideration and appropriate action regarding Resolution 5969, authorizing the award of a contract for natural gas operator qualification training to Gasti, Inc. (HABE) for an amount not to exceed \$70,000.00 for a two year period; for a period of one year with the option to renew one additional one-year term.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The current award recommendation for the Natural Gas Operator Qualification training is not expected to exceed an amount of \$70,000.00 and will be funded through the operating budgets and/or available reserves.

SUMMARY:

The Texas Railroad Commission (RRCT) requires natural gas operator qualification training once every three years to ensure staff are able to recognize, respond, and react to abnormal natural gas systems operating conditions. The RRCT performs a physical audit annually and are required to request task course qualifications of all SAHA personnel that could potentially perform a natural gas system abnormal operation task (CFR 49.192 Subpart N, and Subpart 192.803).

SAHA requires a vendor to provide this training to SAHA Managers, Maintenance Supervisors, and Maintenance Technicians. The training shall include all necessary components to operate natural gas distribution lines (both master metered and non-master metered) efficiently, safely and effectively. Training topics shall include **Gas Operator Safety**: characteristics and hazards of natural gas, potential ignition sources (indoor and outdoor), recognizing emergency conditions, recognizing and reporting natural gas leaks, proper fire fighting techniques, and controlling the accidental release of gas; **Customer Service Part 1**: leak classification, operating the combustible gas indicator, operating the flame ionization unit, bar hole testing and purging, leak surveys and patrols, and customer leak investigation; **Customer Services Part 2**: Combustion and ventilation air, pilot lights, gas - air adjustment, venting, pressure checks to establish gas service, and establishing and disconnecting gas; **Receiving and Dispatching**: receiving

calls, collecting information, relaying information to others, documentation of information; **Emergency Response and Restoration of Services**: plastic pipe (poly) repair, and lighting appliances. A certificate of completion will be provided to each student that successfully completes the training course.

On August 8, 2019, SAHA issued an Invitation For Bids (IFB) #1904-924-86-4912 for Natural Gas Operator Qualification Training that closed on August 26, 2019. The IFB was published on the SAHA website, Electronic State Business Daily (ESBD), The Hart Beat, posted on NAHRO, Public Purchase and direct solicited to eleven companies. A total of one bid was received in response to this solicitation: GASTI, Inc. (HABE). The bid was evaluated on the following criteria: purchase price, reputation of the bidder and their goods or services, the quality of the goods or services, extent to which the goods or services meet SAHA's needs, total long term cost, and any relevant criteria contained in the solicitation document. Based on the above, we are recommending contract award to GASTI, Inc. Their bid was determined to be both responsive and responsible and their pricing was deemed to be fair and reasonable.

GASTI, Inc. was established in 1999, and is located in Corpus Christi, Texas. This contractor self-certifies as an HABE. GASTI, Inc. is a safety training institute that also provides leak surveys and patrols; maintenance of natural gas lines; meter installation; gas leak repairs; installation of gas main and services; and Railroad Commission record keeping. GASTI, Inc. has received prior awards from SAHA for natural gas operator qualification training and natural gas systems inspection, patrols and reporting. Their Texas clients include City of Cotulla; City of Falfurrias; City of Marfa; and City of Ft. Stockton. Additionally, they have worked with the following housing authorities: Balmorhea Housing Authority; Eagle Pass Housing Authority; Haltom City Housing Authority; Duval County Housing Authority; and Corpus Christi Housing Authority. GASTI's Section 3 Good Faith Effort Plan includes providing safety training to Section 3 individuals on Forklift Safety.

CONTRACT OVERSIGHT:

Contract oversight will be provided by Hector Martinez, Director of Construction Services and Sustainability, and Mark DeLuna, Maintenance Superintendent, who will monitor the vendor's adherence to contract requirements and performance. FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The current award recommendation for the Cassiano burn units rehabilitation is not expected to exceed an amount of \$1,143,437.00, to include a base bid in the amount of \$917,778.00, plus unit priced items in the amount of \$76,515.00 and a 15% contingency in the amount of \$149,144.00 that will only be used if necessary. This project will be funded by CFP Grant Funds, insurance proceeds, and/or available reserves.

SUMMARY:

Cassiano Homes is a Public Housing family community built in 1953, and is located on the west side of San Antonio. This community is comprised of 499 units to include 24 one-bedroom, 172 two-bedroom, 192 three-bedroom, 85 four-bedroom, and 26 five-bedroom units. SAHA requires the services of a qualified general contractor to rebuild eight units (3023 Laredo, 1501 San Carlos, 1523 San Carlos, 1818 Krocker, 942 Merida, 103 San Liro, 2404 Tampico, and 2410 Chihuahua) at this community that have sustained substantial fire and water damage.

On June 24, 2019, SAHA issued an Invitation For Bids (IFB) #1905-909-23-4929 for Cassiano Burn Units Rehabilitation that closed on August 27, 2019. The IFB was published on the SAHA website, Electronic State Business Daily (ESBD), The Hart Beat, posted on NAHRO, Public Purchase and direct solicited to 173 contractors. A total of three bids were received in response to this solicitation: All Pro General Construction, Inc. (DBE, ESBE, HABE, MBE, SBE, Section 3 Business), Cleanology Construction Services (ABE, ESBE, MBE, SBE, Section 3 Business), and Geofill Material Technologies, LLC (SBE, Section 3 Business). All bids were evaluated on the following criteria: purchase price, reputation of the bidder and their goods or services, the quality of the goods or services, extent to which the goods or services meet SAHA's needs, total long term cost, and any relevant criteria contained within the solicitation document. Based on the above, we are recommending contract award to Geofill Material Technologies, LLC. They are the lowest priced responsive and responsible bidder.

Geofill Material Technologies, LLC was founded in 2003, and is located in Schertz, Texas. This contractor has been certified as an SBE by the South Central Texas Regional Certification Agency and a Section 3 Business by SAHA. They specialize in commercial and residential services that include construction management services, new construction, rehabilitation and renovations, large and catastrophic loss, roofing, life and safety repairs, interior rehabilitation and finish out, painting and flooring, in house heating and cooling repairs and replacement, energy audits and weatherization. Geofill Material Technologies, LLC has received prior awards from SAHA for Prefabricated Metal Building for Garcia Street Urban Farm; Matt Garcia structural repairs; unit make ready for public housing; 10145 Galesburg reconstruction; H.B. 



Consideration and appropriate action regarding Resolution 5964, authorizing the conveyance of Phillis Wheatley Park, located at 723 Arthur Street, San Antonio, Texas 78202, to the City of San Antonio to own, maintain, and operate as part of the Wheatley Choice Neighborhood Implementation Grant Initiative.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) approved the use of \$709,142.00 in Choice Neighborhood "Housing" funds for the construction of the Phillis Wheatley Park. HUD also approved \$200,000.00 in Choice Neighborhood "Critical Community Improvements" funds for art installations within the park. SAHA will convey the park land and improvements at no cost in exchange for ownership, maintenance, and operation of the park in perpetuity by the City of San Antonio.

SUMMARY:

In December of 2012, the San Antonio Housing Authority (SAHA) was awarded a Choice Neighborhood Implementation Grant, in the amount of \$29.7 million dollars, which involves strategies for People, Housing, and Neighborhood. As part of the housing component, residents and community stakeholders asked for a park that the community could use for gatherings and a safe place for children to play.

As a result, SAHA reserved a one acre parcel for a linear park that was planned, designed and named by the residents and community. SAHA worked in partnership with the City of San Antonio, DHR Architects, and Straight Line Management to build the Phillis Wheatley park. SAHA also worked with artist Reginald Adams, to incorporate art installations that memorialize the poet Phillis Wheatley and the actor Ira Aldridge. The artist also included lions that represent the mascot of the former Wheatley High School and decorative tiled benches.

The park includes such amenities as a covered playground, exercise station, grand pavilion, covered sitting areas, green space and water fountain.

Empower and equip families to improve their quality of life and achieve economic stability.





SUMMARY

The following describes the activities related to the three core components of the Choice Neighborhood Initiative: People, Housing and Neighborhood. The activities are associated with metrics submitted to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) on both a quarterly and annual basis.

CHOICE NEIGHBORHOOD GRANT ADMINISTRATION

The regularly scheduled HUD monthly call for August 13, 2019, was canceled at HUD's request; therefore, the monthly call to HUD will resume September 10, 2019.

Budget Revision 17 was approved on August 13, 2019. Budget Revision 18 was submitted to HUD August 29, 2019, and approved August 30, 2019. This approval will allow the drawing down of all endowment funds.

Choice dollars remaining in the grant under Critical Community Improvements that have not been obligated are approximately \$110,000.00. On July 31, 2019, SAHA proposed to use \$5,000.00 in the Park and \$51,000.00 for Public Improvements Phase I and II. In August, HUD had not agreed to allow SAHA to move these funds as it would require a reopening of the phase. On August 18, 2019, HUD informed SAHA that they would be approving no new activities within the CCI plan and any funds outstanding would be recaptured.

The Endowment Trust Proposal has been approved, as of August 27, 2019. Budget Revision 18 is for the spread of the Endowment funds. Choice dollars remaining in the grant under Community & Supportive Services for the Endowment are \$572,463.68; however, after HUD's direction to move any unexpended dollars into the Endowment, that number is now \$692,551.08. The increase will pay for the outstanding payments to Urban Strategies.

Reading standards have fallen, while math standards have increased. The increase in math can be attributed to the increased rigor in STEM related curriculum. Urban Strategies Inc. will continue to address the need for improved academic proficiency and educational attainment by encouraging reading growth and engaging youth in innovative math activities.

The five years of Urban Case management has reduced family conditions and improved stability among residents by reducing family risk scores by 64% (256 down to 92).

Urban Strategies Inc. (USI) strength-based case management approach has resulted in a strong bond with residents and the community. USI has conducted monthly resident meetings beginning in December of 2013. During the years, USI began to identify the quiet leaders of the community and began mentoring those residents. In June of 2019, USI offered residents the opportunity to design, plan and implement the September resident meeting. Those quiet leaders accepted the challenge and on August 29, 2019, they held the first resident designed and planned meeting. These leaders have committed to continue to be accountable for monthly meetings at the East Meadows Apartments.

USI Case Managers have aligned resident needs and community resources that empower and provide stability for households in need of services. Community partners have realigned process and re-written programming in an attempt to meet the needs of the residents. With these tools in hand and the support from the surrounding community, Choice residents will continue their road to stable and thriving.

Choice Neighborhood was able to secure \$20,000,000.00 from the City of San Antonio, as well as, \$43 million in tax credits and private investments for the implementation of the Housing and Neighborhood components. In all, the \$29,750,000.00 Choice Neighborhood Implementation grant has provided for over \$180,000,000.00 in investment to this community.
- 5. Choice Neighborhood has acquired fifteen vacant lots, three of these lots have vacant structures that are in line for demolition, in order to make way for owner occupied single family housing. Twelve two and three-bedroom homes are under construction on the vacant lots to provide affordable housing for buyers with incomes not to exceed 120% AMI. To maintain affordability, the homes can only be resold to a buyer meeting the 120% AMI standards for 20 years after the initial purchase. The homes are scheduled for completion by November 1, 2019. An additional sixteen homes are planned for future construction. The developer is responsible for funding the construction and selling the homes.
- 6. Choice has provided twenty Owner Occupied Rehab grants in the neighborhood. All twenty rehab projects have been completed.
- 7. The unit mix for all four housing phases provides for families of all income levels to reside at the new development. Each phase offers Public Housing, Section 8 or Project Based Voucher, affordable and market rate units.
- 8. The new development was designed to be inclusive of the surrounding community. Each building fronts the street with fencing only between the buildings for limited access to the public. A BiblioTech library was created on-site for use by residents of the new development, and by the surrounding community. Finally, the new Phillis Wheatley Park, which has completed construction, and is located between the East Meadows and Wheatley Park Senior Living community will provide a meeting, play and art space for the neighborhood.

SUMMARY

The SAHA Strategic Plan was adopted in 2012, and established agency goals through 2020. An update process is currently underway to draft a new strategic plan. This memo describes the work that has been completed to date, as well as, immediate next steps.

IMPACT STATEMENT

In general, an impact statement describes the ultimate, long-term impact of the work.

- Draft impact statement: "San Antonio Area has a high quality of life where all are thriving."
- The strategic plan impact statement was drafted in April and emphasizes the following:
 - SAHA's impact is not limited to certain neighborhoods, but extends throughout the San Antonio area due to the regional nature of housing markets and household mobility
 - o SAHA's work has a broad impact on the quality of life of all San Antonians, as a

- result of the agency's concerted attention on the housing needs of low-income San Antonians
- Ultimate desired impact is "thriving" -- building on and going beyond stability and growth

QUALITY OF LIFE

Maslow's hierarchy of needs was identified as a useful framework to organize the plan around quality of life impact. Maslow's hierarchy is often used to study individuals' behavior and motivation. Sometimes displayed as a pyramid, the framework describes a sequence of motivation that starts with physical needs. In principle, each level must be satisfied before an individual is motivated to pursue needs at the next higher level.

When combined with the impact statement, the hierarchy of needs for the purposes of the SAHA strategic plan would be:

- 6. San Antonio Area (SAA) residents work toward the achievement of common good
- 5. SAA residents achieve their potential
- 4. SAA residents have sense of esteem and accomplishment
- 3. SAA residents have social needs met
- 2. SAA residents have stability and safety needs met
- 1. SAA residents have physical needs met

THEORY OF CHANGE

In general, a theory of change describes a sequence of necessary outcomes and preconditions that result in the ultimate desired impact, as described in the impact statement. The latest draft of the Strategic Plan theory of change is the product of multiple discussions with the full Senior Team, as well as, small-group work sessions.

The initial sequence of outcomes was drafted directly from Maslow's hierarchy of needs. The next version of the theory of change developed more specific outcomes that describe how Maslow's language applies to the context of the SAHA strategic plan. Subsequent iterations produced chains of preconditions, as well as, potential connections between outcomes at different hierarchy levels.

The latest working draft of the TOC highlights twenty-four general outcomes, without detailing all the preconditions. Each Maslow hierarchy level has at least one outcome. The level with the most outcomes is "stability and safety", with nine outcomes.

KEY POPULATIONS

Three populations have been identified as key populations for the strategic plan: SAHA clients, SAHA staff, and community / neighbors. Priority outcomes and implementation strategies are built around the desired impact on these key populations.

The Senior Team undertook a prioritization exercise on July 24 to identify the most important high-level outcomes. The exercise focused on only one of the key populations: SAHA clients. Later exercises will focus on other key populations. The results of this exercise are the most important 5-year outcomes related to SAHA clients:

- 1. Supply of affordable quality units exist in sufficient quantities
- 2. SAHA clients live in quality, affordable homes
- 3. SAHA clients feel safe
- 4. SAHA clients complete educational / vocational goals and are recognized / rewarded accordingly

NEXT STEPS

- 1. Identify priority 5-year outcomes for SAHA staff
- 2. Develop 5-year and 1-year implementation plans for each 5-year outcome, to include metrics, targets, and strategies
- 3. Timeline goal: finalize implementation plans by December in order to be incorporated into budget cycle







Maslow Hierarchy = initial theory of change




Theory of Change, v4: focus on big picture
